Dining Plans

All first-, second-, and third-year residents must have a dining plan.

- First- and second-year resident students: minimum cost: \$8,440 (\$4,220 per semester).
- Third-year resident students: minimum annual cost: \$8,090 (\$4,045 per semester).

All first- and second-year non-resident students must have a dining plan.

- Minimum annual cost: \$1,800 (\$900 per semester).

Part-Time Enrollment

Seniors who require less than 12 credits to graduate may apply for part-time enrollment in their last semester. To apply for part-time enrollment, contact your College Advisor. The advisor will evaluate your planned registration schedule and remaining degree requirements to ensure on-time graduation. If your plan is approved, tuition and mandatory fee rates are modified as follows:

Non-Tulane Semester or Year Abroad

Students taking a leave of absence to participate in an abroad program not managed by Tulane will be assessed a \$1,400 fee if requesting a transfer of hours earned for academic credit at Tulane. Please note that all credits earned abroad must appear on a World Education Services course-by-course transcript evaluation report based on a transcript from an accredited degree-granting institution overseas or on a program provider's accredited U.S. School of Record transcript.



Incoming Exchange Programs

Semester or Year Abroad at Tulane University

Tulane University maintains exchange agreements with universities worldwide. Under the terms of the exchange agreement, participating students continue to pay tuition and fees to the home institution. While most education costs will be billed by your home institution, the Campus Health Fee and any supplemental course fees assessed to support additional instruction costs, supplies, or materials are required. Additionally, enrollment in Tulane’s Student Health Insurance Plan (T-SHIP) is mandatory for all exchange students.

Glossary of Mandatory Fees

The fees listed below are mandatory costs of attendance and are due from the student regardless of participation or receipt of a funded service. Fees are not refunded after the deadline listed on the University Academic Calendar for 100% tuition and fee refund.

Academic Support Services Fee - The Academic Support Services Fee provides certain academic resources to all Tulane students. The fee enables students to access the University’s computer services, data, voice, and Internet, including services provided by outside vendors. In addition, tutoring and counseling services, an online library, inter-loan services, and other support services, such as the language and science laboratories, are covered by this fee.

Student Activity Fee - The student body at Tulane has assessed itself a Student Activity Fee to support its activities. The Student Activity fee entitles students to participate in or attend supported activities, readership of a weekly student newspaper, and admission to many events, movies, and lectures.

Recreation Center Fee - Fulltime students, except for the Schools of Medicine, Public Health and Tropical Medicine and Social Work will be assessed for membership to the Reily Recreation Center. School of Medicine, Public Health and Tropical Medicine and Social Work will be assessed for downtown TU Fit Center membership. Part-time students have the option to join the Recreation Center.

Campus Health Fee - The Campus Health fee provides students with primary, psychiatric, and contraceptive care at the Campus Health Center. It also contributes to health education programs, drug/alcohol counseling, and the Tulane Emergency Medical Service. This fee is not a health insurance premium.
