School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine

The primary program of the enrolled student determines tuition and fee rates. This document describes tuition and fees for graduate-level students in the School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine. Except where otherwise noted, these rates apply to all registered credit hours in the semester. These costs do not include books and optional campus services such as housing, dining plans, health insurance premiums, parking permits, required computer hardware, and others. Tuition and fee rates are updated annually with each new Fall semester.

Additional course fees may be required, as listed on the Schedule of Classes.

Tulane Student Health Insurance Plan (T-SHIP)

Degree-seeking students are required to maintain adequate medical insurance coverage. You may subscribe to T-SHIP or an adequate alternative plan*. If you have or obtain adequate alternative coverage, **you must opt out of T-SHIP by providing evidence of your adequate coverage by the compliance deadline**. * All non-US citizens and permanent resident students will be enrolled in T-SHIP. Domestic students in the Online Doctoral, Online MPH, Online MHA, and CAEPH distance learning programs are eligible to enroll in the University-sponsored plan but are not required to enroll or waive coverage and will not be automatically enrolled.

Glossary of Mandatory Fees

The fees listed below are mandatory costs of attendance and are due from the student regardless of participation or receipt of a funded service. Fees are not refunded after the deadline listed on the University Academic Calendar for 100% tuition and fee refund.

Academic Support Services Fee - The Academic Support Services Fee provides certain academic resources to all Tulane students. The fee enables students to access the University's computer services, data, voice, and Internet, including services provided by outside vendors. In addition, tutoring and counseling services, an online library, inter-loan services, and other support services, such as the language and science laboratories, are covered by this fee.

Student Activity Fee - The student body at Tulane has assessed itself a Student Activity Fee to support its activities. The Student Activity fee entitles students to participate in or attend supported activities, readership of a weekly student newspaper, and admission to many events, movies, and lectures.

Recreation Center Fee - Fulltime students, except for the Schools of Medicine, Public Health and Tropical Medicine and Social Work will be assessed for membership to the Reily Recreation Center. School of Medicine, Public Health and Tropical Medicine and Social Work will be assessed for downtown TU Fit Center membership. Part-time students have the option to join the Recreation Center.

Campus Health Fee - The Campus Health fee provides students with primary, psychiatric, and contraceptive care at the Campus Health Center. It also contributes to health education programs, drug/alcohol counseling, and the Tulane Emergency Medical Service. This fee is not a health insurance premium.
